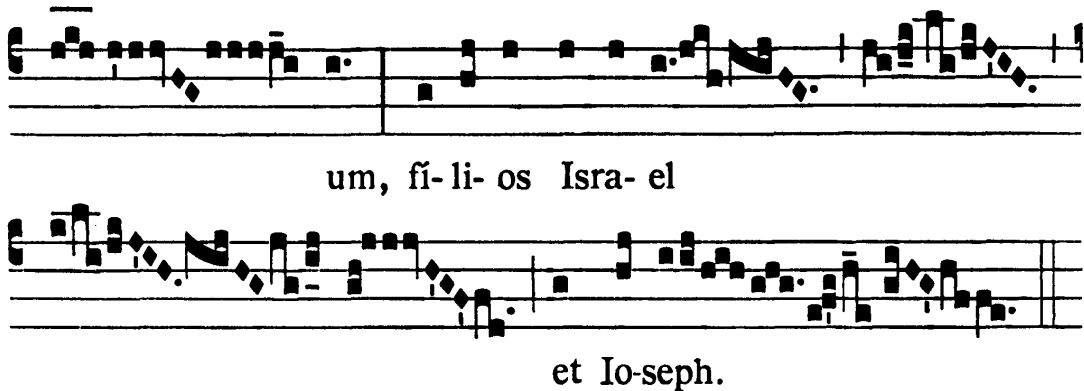

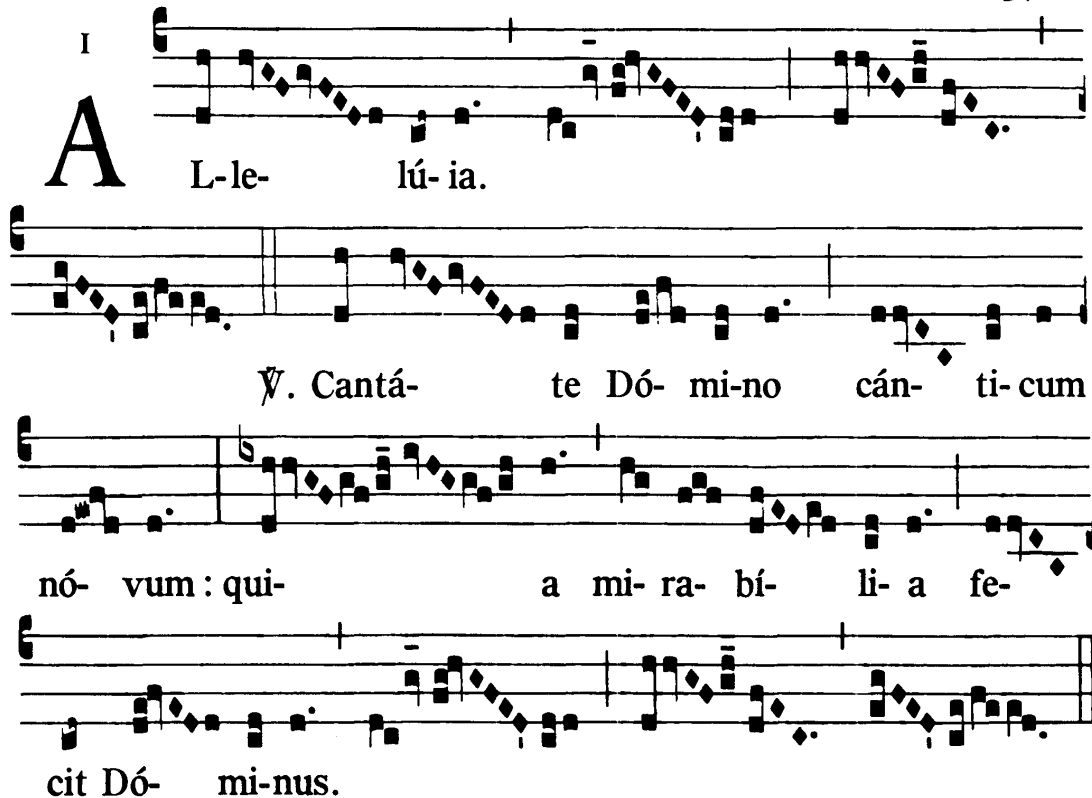

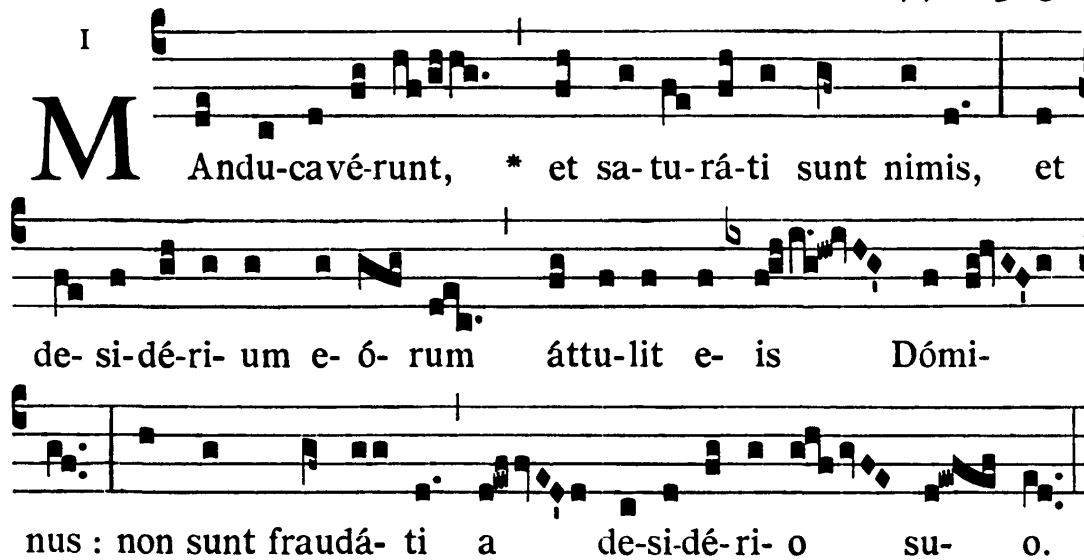
Prayer over the Gifts
